Objectives

This call aims to strengthen the economic sustainability, digital transformation, and democratic role of European news media by supporting innovation actions that develop new business models, AI-enabled tools, recommender systems, trust indicators, and pan-European media solutions. Projects should help journalism remain viable, visible, and trustworthy in AI-driven and platform-mediated information ecosystems, while empowering citizens—especially disadvantaged groups—to make informed democratic choices.

Scope summary

Democracies are weakened when independent journalism lacks sustainable financing. Newsrooms face severe economic pressure due to platform competition, AI-driven content distribution, declining advertising revenues, and information disorder.

The call supports solution-driven innovation to:

- Distinguish professional journalism from opinion, misinformation, and low-quality content
- Promote journalistic standards (accuracy, independence, pluralism, inclusivity)
- Develop AI-enabled, user-centric, and revenue-generating media services

- Strengthen Europe’s media ecosystem through cross-border collaboration and interoperability

Projects must work with news media organisations from the outset and focus on deployable, scalable solutions within the project lifetime.

Any Special Eligibility Notes: Subject to restrictions for the protection of European communication networks

Budget & Funding Structure

- **Indicative Project Budget Range:** EUR 3.50 – 4.00 million
- **Funding Rate:** Up to 100% of eligible costs (Innovation Action)
- **Cost Model:** Lump sum funding

- Contribution to media sustainability and democratic resilience
- Citizen empowerment and exposure to plural viewpoints
